Potential Knowles Nelson Grant for New Accessible Fishing Pier

The Friends submitted a Knowles Nelson Stewardship Grant application to the DNR for a new accessible fishing pier on Lupo Pond, to replace the existing fishing pier, shown here. The pier would meet ADA/ABA Guidelines for accessibility and would be located on the other side of the pond, so that an accessible path could be provided from the Evergreen parking lot. Approval of the grant won't be known until spring, and then fundraising will be required to provide the Friends' match to the grant. If you have an interest in improving accessibility to the park's amenities, such as the Lupo Pond – designated as an Urban Fishing Pond – **please consider a donation towards the pier project in your year-end giving.**

Restored Increase Lapham Map

Join us at **Hawks Inn, Delafield History Center, 428 Wells Street, Delafield, on January 4, 2026 from 3:00 pm - 5:00 pm.** \$10 admission at the door. Wine and light refreshments are served. There will be a fascinating lecture on a beautifully restored 1853 map of southern Wisconsin that was the hand-colored map created by renowned naturalist, Increase Lapham. Discover how this rare piece of history captures the region's early landscape and development. It is a treasure for anyone who appreciates Wisconsin's past and the art of cartography.



Increase Lapham's personal map was carried in a leather case in his pocket. The 36 folds had weakened or destroyed the paper in many places. The Hawks Inn Historical Society secured a grant from The Greater Delafield Community Fund to have it restored. Hope you can join us!
